At Viceroy Bali, we believe that meaningful hospitality extends beyond our resort and into the communities that surround us. Through our partnership with [Yayasan Green Books Indonesia](#), we are proud to support the **Zero Waste School Program**, an initiative that empowers schools to reduce waste, eliminate single-use plastics, and foster environmental awareness among the next generation.

Since July 2025, the programme has expanded across eight primary schools in Bali, reaching more than **2,200 students** through environmental education, practical waste management systems, and sustainable school canteen initiatives.

Schools Supported

Batch 1 (Since July 2025)

- SDN 1 Peguyangan – 403 students
- SDN 12 Peguyangan – 253 students
- SDN 3 Ubung – 371 students
- SDN 6 Ubung – 385 students

Batch 2 (Since January 2026)

- SD No. 1 Canggu – 182 students

Overall Impact: 2,298 students across **eight schools**.

Creating Lasting Change

Learning from a Zero Waste Role Model

School principals, teachers and canteen representatives visited SDN 11 Kesiman, a recognised Zero Waste role model school in Denpasar. The visit offered practical insights into operating profitable school canteens without relying on single-use plastics, while providing an open forum to discuss implementation, challenges and long-term success.

The session was supported by representatives from the Denpasar Education Department and sustainability partners, who shared innovative approaches to reducing plastic waste in schools.

Plastic-Free School Canteens

To support lasting behavioural change, **2,582 reusable foodware items** were distributed across six participating school canteens. Ongoing monitoring has shown encouraging adoption as schools transition away from disposable packaging and embrace reusable alternatives.

Empowering Teachers Through Education

Teachers from participating schools continue to receive intensive training, equipping them with practical resources to deliver environmental education in the classroom. Lessons encourage students to understand waste reduction, responsible consumption and sustainable daily habits through engaging, hands-on activities.

The educational programme is currently being implemented across Grades 1–6, reaching hundreds of students each week.

Supporting Sustainable Infrastructure

The programme also strengthens schools with practical waste management solutions, including:

- Installation of **Teba Modern composting facilities**
- Introduction of waste separation systems
- Distribution of reusable foodware for school canteens

These initiatives help schools reduce landfill waste while creating healthier and more sustainable learning environments.

Looking Ahead

The partnership continues to grow with the next stages of the programme, including:

- Expansion of waste separation systems
- Additional Teba Modern composting installations
- Distribution of Zero Waste Lunch Kits for teachers
- Endline waste audits to measure long-term impact
- Preparation for **Batch 3**, welcoming additional schools across Bali from July 2026

Together with Yayasan Green Books Indonesia, we remain committed to supporting education, reducing environmental impact, and inspiring future generations to care for the island they call home.
